

TIMSS 2011 TIMSS 2011 Target Populations

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As described in the [Sample Design in TIMSS and PIRLS](#), the *international target populations* for the TIMSS 2011 fourth and eighth grade assessments were defined as the grades that represented 4 and 8 years of formal schooling, respectively, counting from the first year of primary or elementary schooling.¹ Exhibit 1 and Exhibit 2 present the grades identified as the target grades for sampling by each country, and include the number of years of formal schooling that the grades represent and the average age of students in the target grades at the time of testing.

For most countries participating in TIMSS, the target grades did indeed turn out to be the grades with 4 and 8 years of schooling, i.e., fourth and eighth grades, respectively. However, in England, Malta, and New Zealand, children begin primary school at an early age. Therefore, these countries administered the TIMSS fourth grade assessment in the fifth year of schooling and England and New Zealand administered the TIMSS eighth grade assessment in the ninth year of schooling. Despite assessing a higher grade, the students in these countries were among the youngest in TIMSS 2011.

To provide a better match with the demands of the assessments, several countries, including Botswana, Honduras, Yemen, and South Africa, availed of the option to assess students at a higher grade. Botswana, Honduras, and Yemen administered the fourth grade assessment at sixth grade, and Botswana, Honduras, and South Africa administered the eighth grade assessment at ninth grade. Yemen also administered the fourth grade assessment at the fourth grade.

¹ Given the cognitive demands of the assessments, TIMSS and PIRLS want to avoid assessing very young students. Thus, TIMSS recommends assessing the next higher grade (i.e., fifth grade for fourth grade TIMSS and ninth grade for eighth grade TIMSS) if, for fourth grade students, the average age at the time of testing would be less than 9.5 years and, for eighth grade students, less than 13.5 years.

- 1 Armenia in 2011 was in the process of adding an extra grade to compulsory schooling and starting primary school one year earlier than previously. As part of the transition, many of the students in grade 9 in 2011 had skipped a grade and gone directly from grade 3 to grade 5. Accordingly, Grade 9 was assessed as the eighth year of formal schooling. However, this grade contained students with either 8 or 9 years of schooling.
- 2 Bahrain assessed the same cohort of students as other countries, but in October 2011 at the beginning of the next school year.
